ADHD

There is a lot of information in the press recently about **ADHD: Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder** and more children and adults are receiving a diagnosis. People with ADHD show a persistent pattern of behaviours that interfere with day-to-day functioning and/or development and around 5% of children have the disorder. ADHD is more than hyperactivity and inattention and there is a range of difficulties associated with the disorder: hyperactivity, attention deficit, impulsivity, emotional dysregulation, weak executive functioning (planning, organising, problem solving) mental health difficulties, including low self-esteem and rejection sensitivity dysphoria (emotional over-reactivity or sensitivity to criticism or rejection).

ADHD is a disorder that is defined by analysis of behaviour and diagnosis is via medical practitioners, usually over a period of time of around 6 months. All people with ADHD will have their own unique difficulties and patience, understanding and time are needed to support.

Some parents trial ADHD medication to explore if this will benefit their child.




Moore Class have also been exploring part-whole models this week in their

They have already researched the history of sewing, looked at how cushions are made and have learned how to thread a needle and sew using a running stitch. Some children even managed a cross stitch which is very impressive!

This half term in their design and technology lessons, Attenborough Class (Year 1) have been learning about where fruit is grown around the world. Throughout November, the children have used their senses to explore the taste and texture of different fruits. They used this exploration to design their own fruit kebab recipe cards using fruit that they love.

During the unit of work, the children developed their fine motor skills with some dough disco and practised using kitchen tools safely. They are now looking forward to making and tasting their own fruit kebabs.





King Class (Year 3) recently enjoyed their visit to The BBC Earth Experience at The Daikin Centre, where they enjoyed taking part in an immersive experience where they learned about different animals in their natural habitats across each of the seven continents. King Class also enjoyed learning about sustainability during the course of their visit and made a pledge to protect the environment by planting seeds— which they will be doing in the near future in class.



Parks Class (Year 2) have enjoyed learning about the pirate Alice Leghorn and the information that she needed in order to navigate the world during their geography lessons. They have developed excellent atlas skills and are able to name and identify the seven continents and five oceans of the world. To bring their learning to life, they enjoyed taking part in a Pirate-themed Day where the class dressed up as pirates, learned how to talk like a pirate, solved pirate worded problems in mathematics, wrote pirate stories and even had pirate physical education lesson. It was a fantastic opportunity to bring their learning to life!







Thunberg Class (Year 4) teamed up with King Class (Year 3) for their recent visit to the The BBC Earth Experience at The Daikin Centre, London. The children were transported across each of the seven continents of the world with the help of narration from Sir David Attenborough. The children absolutely loved the experience and were mesmerized by the sheer size of the screens. They could all sit back, relax and take in the wonders of our world.









In their science lessons, **Mandela Class (Year 5)** are currently exploring the theme of space. The children are asking lots of questions and finding out how we know the Earth is round. **Mandela Class** have also learned about the different planets, their properties and their distance from the sun.

In their geography lessons, Mandela Class are exploring 'Life in Athens.' The children have become experts at naming countries and their capital cities within Europe with the aid of an atlas.

Mandela Class have informed me that their Forest School sessions on Mondays are great fun. During their sessions, they have made clay hedgehogs, pressed leaves onto clay, climbed trees, and even planted some of their own. They have also used their knowledge of Ancient Greece to create an aerial view of the minotaur in his maze from the story of Theseus and the Minotaur.
