Saturn's beautiful rings


Saturn is famous for its beautiful rings made of ice and rocks. These rings can be seen from Earth with a telescope, and they make

Our solar system is part of a giant galaxy called the Milky Way. It's so big that it would take over 1,000 years to fly across it in a spaceship!



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
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Joke Corner
