## Richard Walker (Co-opted Governor: 26/02/2022 - 25/02/2026) Chair of Governors, Chair of Curriculum & Achievement Committee, and on Resources Committee; Member Governor Forum.

I have lived in Hadley Wood since 2012. I became a co-opted governor at Hadley Wood School in February 2018 and was elected to the position of Chair of Governors in September 2022. Following a period in research and lecturing, I spent the 1980's working as a teacher of biology and science in secondary schools in North London. I subsequently became a freelance writer and consultant, specialising in illustrated science books for children and adults. I take a keen interest in community affairs and am actively involved with Neighbourhood Watch. I endeavour to use my experience from education, publishing, project management and community work to support the school and encourage the highest standards. Two of my grandchildren are pupils at Hadley Wood School.

# Komal Parmar (Co-opted Governor: 05/12/23 - 04/12/27) Vice-Chair of Governors, On Curriculum & Achievement Committee; Member Governor Forum. Responsible for Inclusion and Learning Walks.

I was elected as a parent governor in November 2021 and have recently been appointed as a Coopted Governor and Vice-Chair of Governors. I am a part of the Curriculum and Achievement Committee as well as being an Inclusion Governor and Learning Walks Governor. ## Jo Lee (Co-opted Governor - 24/02/2019 - 23/02/2023) Associate Member of Governing Body, on Resources and Curriculum & Achievement Committees (former Chair of Governors, Vice-Chair of Governors, & Chair of Staffing Committee)

I have been a member of the Hadley Wood School Governing Body since November 2013, when I was elected as a parent governor. I transitioned to become a co-opted governor from February 2015 and was the Vice Chair of Governors for four years, before taking up the role of Chair of Governors from February 2019 to December 2022.
